We look forward to welcoming you to San Diego!



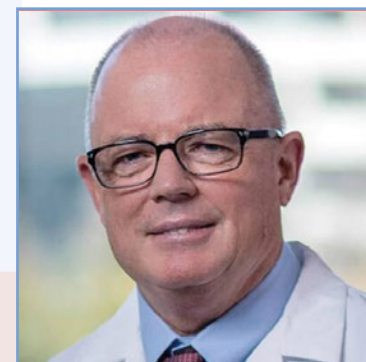

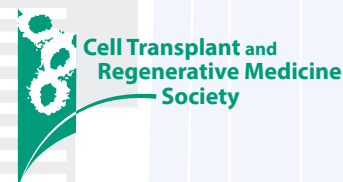

Important Statement

2023 Joint Congress Hybrid In-Person and Virtual Congress

We are currently making plans to host an in-person meeting in San Diego, CA. 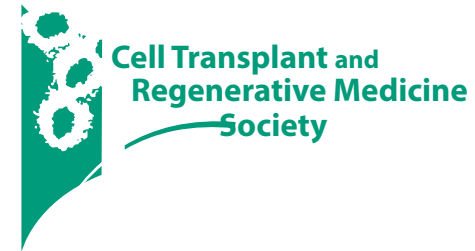
Organizers

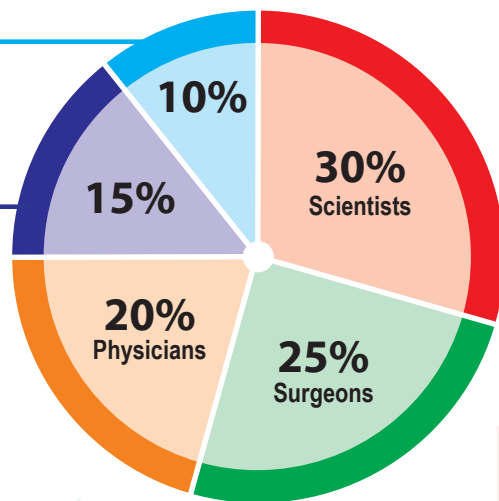

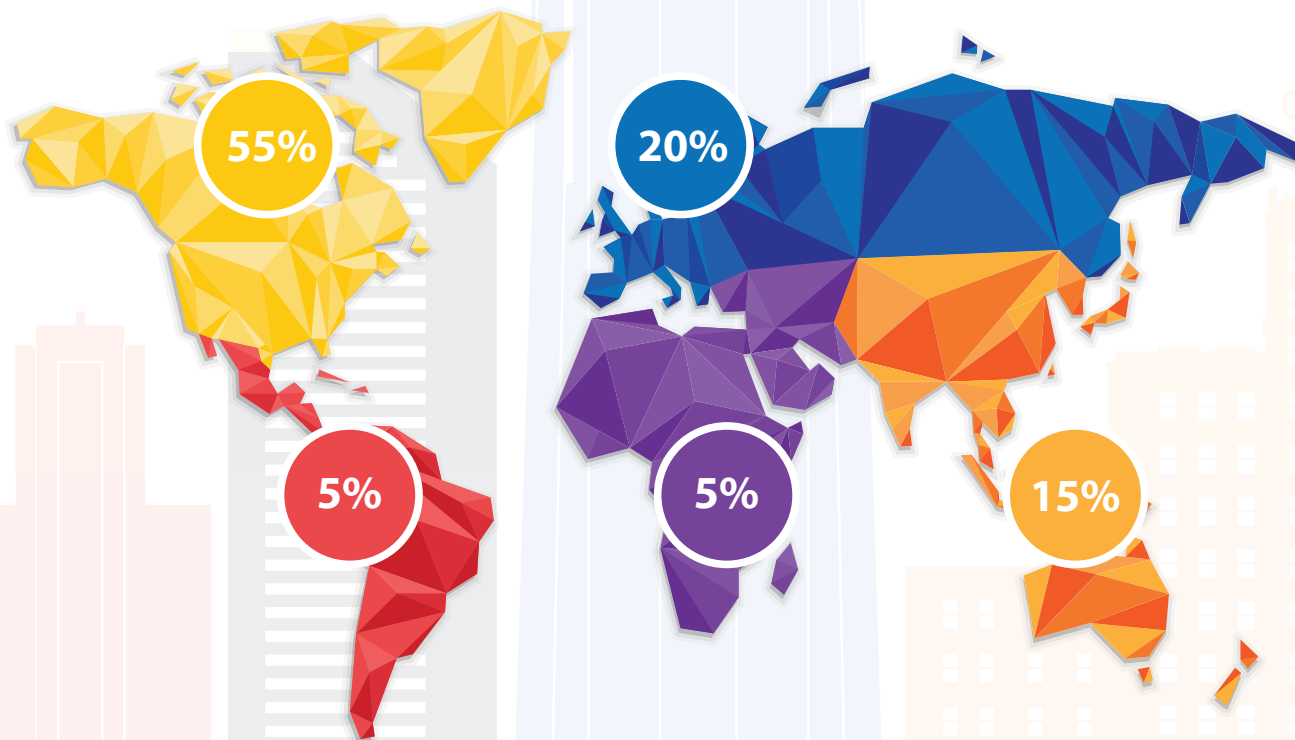

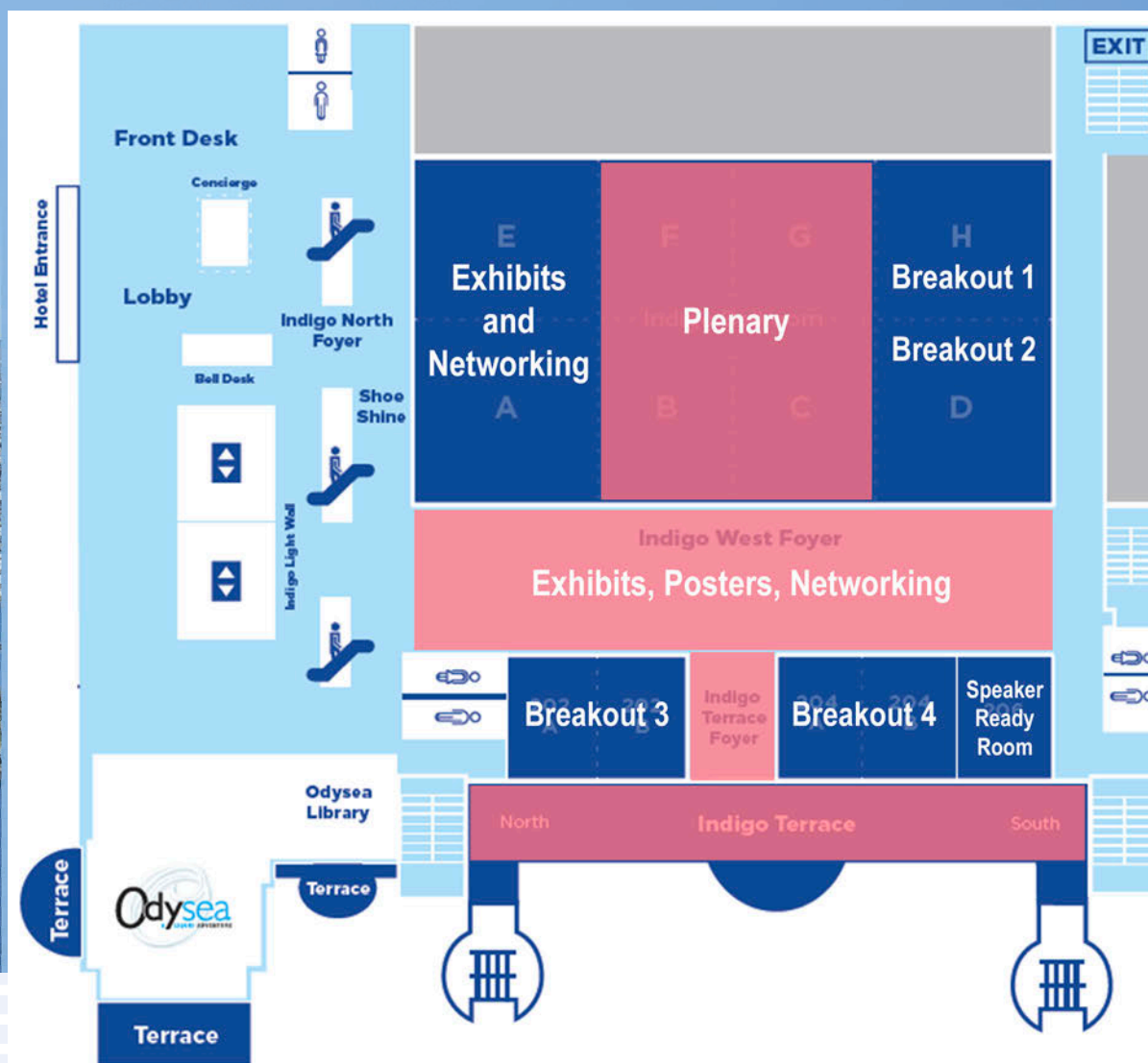
